On 2 October 2006, the UIA and UN-Habitat will celebrate together Cities, magnets of hope on the occasion of World Habitat Day and the World Day of Architecture. This goal increasingly requires the participation of architectects, as we advance toward 2050 when it is predicted that half of the world's population will live in cities.

The official, joint celebration of World Habitat Day and the World Day of Architecture will take place in Naples, in the presence of **Anna Tibaijuka**, Executive Director of UN-Habitat, and **Gaetan Siew**, UIA President. Several UIA Member Sections have informed us that they are organising national celebrations of architecture and habitat on this occasion. These Sections include **Georgia**, **Hungary**, **Portugal**, **Malta**, and the **Philippines**.

QUALITY CRITERIA

On 3 through 6 November, this UIA commission will meet in Melbourne, hosted by the Royal Australian Institute of Architects. This commission has authored an Accord on Recommended International Standards of Professionalism in Architectural Practice, as well as a series of directives in order to encourage and support professional excellence. Nine different language versions of the Accord are available for download from the commission website. These documents are regularly updated, based on a continual dialogue and search for professional concensus among the UIA Member Sections. New issues are also being addressed such as the elaboration of architectural contracts, criteria for mutual recognition agreements, and the portability of architectural diplomas; essential questions at the core of the architectural profession, now and in the future.

The commission recently welcomed new members from Singapore and Morocco, and set up a task force that will help the UIA Member Section to harmonise their national laws with the UIA Accord policies.
